

OIC Schedule 1 — Information Supporting a Michigan Offer in Compromise Based on an Accepted Federal Offer in Compromise

Issued under authority of Public Act 122 of 1941 and Public Act 240 of 2014.

A taxpayer requesting a Michigan Offer in Compromise based on the receipt of a Federal Offer in Compromise must submit the following items before their submission can be reviewed and be considered complete:

- IRS accepted *Offer in Compromise* (Form 656), including any addendums or revisions, if applicable.
- IRS acceptance letter for Offer in Compromise.
- IRS **Account Transcripts** for EACH tax period and tax type included on the IRS Form 656.
- If you would like to designate a third party representative, attach an *Authorized Representative Declaration (Power of Attorney)* (Form 151).
